Preamble: The first record of the voluntary blood donation initiative in India is noted in 1942, at the time of World War II and the first blood bank was established in Kolkata, West Bengal. The blood bank was set up at that time to fulfill the blood needs of those injured in the battle field. Government employees and industrial houses volunteered to donate blood for this humanitarian cause. Once the war ended, the enthusiasm waned and blood bank collections were largely from professional or the paid blood donors. A decade passed by till Mrs. LeelaMoolgaokar initiated voluntary blood donation drive in Bombay (now Mumbai) from 1954 onwards. She was inspired by the blood need of her injured son. In 1971, Prof. J.G. Jolly the founder President of the Indian Society of Blood Transfusion and Immunohematology took the movement to further heights and the Society under his stewardship declared October 1 as National Voluntary Blood Donation Day which was later accepted by the government too. Since then many blood donor organizations came up in different regions of the country in support of the noble cause of voluntary blood donation. The National Blood Policy (2002) and an Action Plan for Blood Safety (2003) were adopted by the Government of India. The NBTC (National Blood Transfusion Council) was entrusted with planning a national campaign.

There are four main blood types: A, B, AB and O. In 1901, Karl Landsteiner, an Austrian physician, discovers the first three human blood groups. On his birthday June 14th"World Blood Donors Day" is celebrated.
